Allied Health Research Report 2020

About Us

The Allied Health Clinical Research Office (AHCRO) at Eastern Health was established as a joint initiative between Eastern Health and La Trobe University, and is led by Professor Nicholas Taylor and Dr Katherine Harding. The Allied Health Clinical Research Office aims to promote, support and do clinical research. The activities of AHCRO are guided by the Allied Health Research Committee, which has representatives from programs, allied health disciplines and research active clinicians.

2020 was certainly an unusual year in the AHCRO. The COVID-19 pandemic brought a huge amount of disruption across both the health and university sectors, and tested our ability to adapt to the challenges of the time. Despite a rapid transition to working remotely, it was still a highly productive year for allied health research with a record number of publications. As the pandemic hit, our research team adapted our work to assist with the cause, conducting two cross-sectional surveys of staff and consumers to gather information about **experiences of telehealth**. This work enabled the rapid collection and distribution information to inform ongoing transition to remote service delivery.

Our largest and most significant trial, **MIHip**, was able to continue with some minor amendments to protocol to enable all aspects of the trial to be delivered without face to face contact with participants. This randomised controlled trial, led by Nicholas Taylor, is funded over 4 years by the NH&MRC and is testing whether 10 sessions of telephone-based motivational interviewing can increase people's confidence in walking, and improve outcomes after hip fracture. As many other interventions and services available to people in the community were suspended or cancelled during Melbourne's extensive period of lockdowns, MIHip participants were appreciative of this telephone-based service that was able to provide social contact and support to people during this difficult time.

Nicholas Taylor is part of a research team that was awarded an NHMRC partnership grant to trial "**MyTherapy**", a consumer driven, self-management program that increases the amount of practice that patients do during an episode of rehabilitation. Eastern Health will be site in the trial Alfred Health, Healthscope and Cabrini Hospital, which commences in 2021.

Throughout 2020 work continued on an ongoing body of research led by **Dr Katherine Harding** on reducing waiting times for health services, using the Specific Timely Appointments for Triage (STAT) model. A trial testing the effectiveness of the model in six paediatric community health services was able to continue, with results expected in 2021. Six workshops were also held for clinicians and managers from around Australia (switching to an online format mid year) to support implementation of this research into practice.

Dr Amy Dennett, our inaugural Grade 4 Research and Translation Fellow, continues to be a rising star in Allied Health research, with multiple successful applications for funding and new publications over the year. The year closed with an announcement that Amy had been successful in receiving a Victorian Cancer Agency Research Fellowship. This highly deserved honour will enable Amy to continue her research based at Eastern Health for a further three years.

In 2020 we farewelled **Dr Judi Porter**, who departed after 12 years at Eastern Health to take up the position of Discipline lead and Professor for Dietetics at Deakin University. Judi made an enormous contribution to research at Eastern Health. She has led a high quality, internationally recognised program of research in dietetics, and inspired a new generation of researchers in this field. We will miss Judi in the corridors of Eastern Health, but look forward to continuing collaboration in her new role.

The annual **Allied Health Research Forum** had to be postponed as the COVID-19 pandemic took hold but was resurrected in October in an online format. While we strayed from our tradition of having a guest speaker, the 3-minute thesis competition was able to continue, giving our clinician researchers the opportunity to share their work in an interesting and entertaining afternoon.

In 2020 an **Allied Health Researcher of the Year Award** was introduced to recognise an Allied Health clinician for integration of research into clinical practice. Dietetics clinician researcher **Lina Breik** was the inaugural winner of this award, in recognition of the progress that she has made on research projects during this challenging year for research. She is leading a retrospective observational study examine micronutrient intake in enteral nutrition in critically ill adult patients in ICU, as well as investigating the perceptions of patients receiving a home enteral nutrition service. She is also leading work at Box Hill Hospital for a multi-centre randomised controlled trial. Lina has also been active in developing research skills in the dietetic workforce, and has been appointed as the chair of scientific and social programs committee for the Dietitians' Association of Australia Annual conference in 2021. Also **Dr Katherine Harding** received the inaugural **Allied Health Research paper of the year award** for her rigorous research demonstrating that STAT, a low cost data-driven approach to managing wait lists, can lead to sustained reductions in wait times for community and outpatient services.

Due to COVID-19 the Allied Health Research Training Program **Stepping into Research**, which introduces clinicians to research by completing a systematic review, did not proceed for the first time 10 years. However, we were able to continue our efforts to expand the program to make it accessible to other health services. The first Stepping into Research instructor training was run by Nicholas Taylor, Katherine Harding and Nora Shields in August 2020. We look forward to seeing the outcome of the program as it rolls out in multiple Victorian health services in 2021.

Paper of the year 2020

Katherine Harding has been awarded the inaugural Allied Health paper of the year award for her research demonstrating that reduction in waiting times in community and outpatient services across 8 services and more than 3000 patients were sustained at 1 year.
