

Bairnsdale Regional Health Service - Eastern Health Rural Rotation

Twenty-five Interns matched to Eastern Health will be rostered to Bairnsdale Regional Health Service (BRHS) in 2022.

The Bairnsdale Regional Hospital rotations for Eastern Health Interns in 2022 are:

- 2 Interns rostered to the Emergency Department
- 2 Interns rostered to General Medicine
- 1 Intern rostered to General Surgery

Bairnsdale Regional Health Service (BRHS)

BRHS provides services including comprehensive primary care, acute care, aged care, community and home based health services to a growing population of over 45,000 people across a land mass of 21,000 square kilometres.

- **Tambo ward** is a new combined acute medical/surgical bed ward with 33 beds, incorporating a 3 bed High Dependency Unit
- **Rotamah ward** is a 17 bed diverse unit comprising of maternity, paediatric, palliative and general medical patients.
- **Flanagan ward** is a 20 bed rehabilitation ward with rehabilitation, geriatric evaluation, 2 transition care program beds and 1 AOD (Alcohol and Other Drug) withdrawal bed.

BRHS provides the opportunity for Interns to practice Medicine (over 16,000 patient admissions per year) in an environment where they can experience 'hands on' medicine in a breadth and depth of situations not always possible in a metropolitan environment.

BRHS, due to its geographic distance from Melbourne, is Victoria's largest user of ARV (Adult Retrieval Victoria). Interns who are completing the Emergency Department rotation will gain experience in stabilisation/retrieval medicine, in addition to managing the presentations of the 24,000 patients who attend the ED each year.

The General Medicine rotation at BRHS provide Interns with the opportunity to manage patients of varying acuity levels under the management of the local GP VMO's (Visiting GP's), as well as the BRHS Physicians. This provides great exposure to a unique model of hospital care; and highly beneficial for those interns considering General Practice or Rural Generalist Practice as a career.

The surgical rotation allows interns to experience surgical patient management on the ward, as well as pre-admission clinic duties, and active involvement in theatre with rostered two half days every week. Two operating theatres at BRHS run full time; with General Surgery as well as visiting specialists conducting Vascular, Orthopaedic, Ophthalmologic, Urological, Gastroenterological, Gynaecological and Obstetric surgeries plus more.

The accommodation for Interns at Bairnsdale is new and modern, and is situated opposite the Hospital – making it literally a 1minute walk across the road to work!

In Bairnsdale, you are only 30 minutes away from the beaches and ocean with the likes of the stunning Lakes Entrance, Paynesville, and Metung at your doorstep and just 2 hours from the ski-fields of Mt Hotham in winter.

At BRHS you will find a welcoming, collegiate hospital which will provide you with a wealth of experiences to commence your medical career!



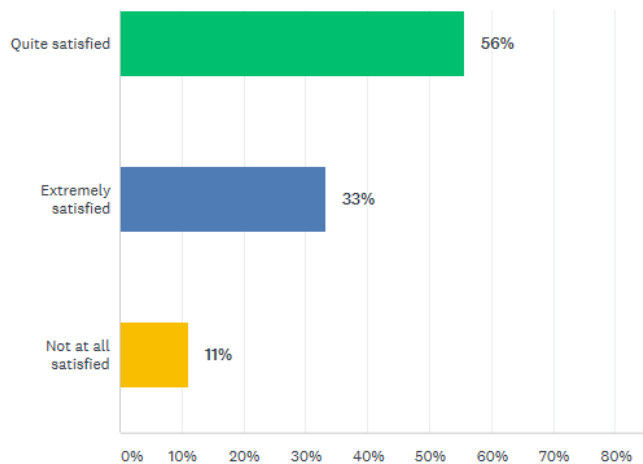
Annual Bairnsdale Intern Survey
