Is a Referral required?

What is the Movement Disorders Program?

The Movement Disorders Program is a team of specialised health professionals who support people living with Parkinson's and Parkinson's related conditions in an outpatient, centre-based program.

Our team works together with clients and carers to promote safety, well-being and independence to optimise quality of life.

We recognise each person with Parkinson's as unique. The team members involved will change according to individual goals and needs.

Who is in our Team?

- Parkinson's Clinical Nurse Consultant
- Neurologist (if required)
- Physiotherapist
- Occupational Therapist
- Speech Pathologist
- Social Worker
- Dietitian
- Neuropsychologist

What does the program provide?

Our outpatient program provides education, therapy, practical advice and support based on client goals. Services offered may include:

- Advice on how to get the most out of your prescribed medications.
- Strategies to help overcome movement difficulties and improve the ability to perform daily tasks.
- Helping you to take ownership and control of your condition through education and advice.
- Assessment of your home (where indicated) to maximise independence and safety and reduce the risk of falls.
- Advice about planning for your future e.g. Powers of Attorney.
- Information about relevant community services, agencies and entitlements to support you.
- Specialist neurology services.
- Exercise, Relaxation and Carer
 Information/Support Groups if required

Is there a cost?

There is a small cost for our service. This will be discussed with you when you are first contacted by telephone. In case of financial hardship, special arrangements regarding costs can be negotiated.
