Eastern Health is working in partnership with Monash University and community pharmacies to help reduce the risk involved in patients using multiple medications.



Turning Point, in partnership with Monash University and Eastern Health Foundation, was awarded a \$1.2 million grant from Google to develop a national suicide monitoring system over the next three years. The project will involve using artificial intelligence to assist with the coding of national ambulance suicide-related attendance data.



In partnership with Beyond Blue, the Movember Foundation, Monash University and ambulance services around Australia, Eastern Health, through Turning Point, officially launched its three-year study findings into ambulance responses to men's mental health in May.



Dementia diagnosis is set to be transformed with plans to develop a simple, non-invasive blood test that can predict dementia risk. The *Using blood biomarkers to predict dementia risk and aid dementia diagnosis* project is set to commence in early 2020, following a \$150,000 medical research grant from The Ian Potter Foundation. Funds will be used to purchase a Simoa Quanterix HD-1 machine, which will be based at Box Hill Hospital and used to detect markers of neurodegeneration early in the disease process.



Our nursing and midwifery research continued to focus on improving patient outcomes in a number of programs across Eastern Health, and included postgraduate students. There are many examples across the service including research into nurses' decisions and management of medications in intensive care, recognising and responding to clinical deterioration, examining the patient experience of medical emergency team calls and a clinical audit of managing medications through the electronic medical record.

Research is a vital component of providing world-class healthcare. Eastern Health has made substantial progress on a number of significant projects this year, which will provide wide-spread benefits for our community.



In 2019, we launched the DC MedsRec trial, which is a community pharmacy-based service for patients discharged from Box Hill Hospital with four or more medicines, designed to help reduce the risk of harm from dangerous drug interactions. The service is an Australian Digital Health Agency (ADHA) pilot project, undertaken by Eastern Health in partnership with Monash University.



Recent research has also contributed to community outpatient health clinics slashing their waiting times using a model of patient care known as Specific Timely Appointment for Triage (STAT). The joint La Trobe University, Eastern Health and Department of Health and Human Services trial – supported by the National Health and Medical Research Council – resulted in thousands of outpatients spending significantly fewer days waiting to see a health professional.

global rankings of non-university and
non-commercial research organisations,
