

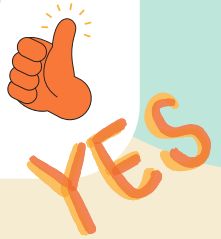


WHAT IS CONSENT

Consent is...



Saying 'YES' to sexual activity given freely and voluntarily without any threats or coercion.



Consent is not...

- Saying 'YES' due to being threatened, coerced or not able to give consent.
- The absence of 'YES' does not equal yes.
- 'NO' does not mean continue trying.



Remember...

- Consent can be withdrawn at any time
- Saying yes to a particular sexual activity does NOT mean saying yes to all sexual activity.



Reforms in Law

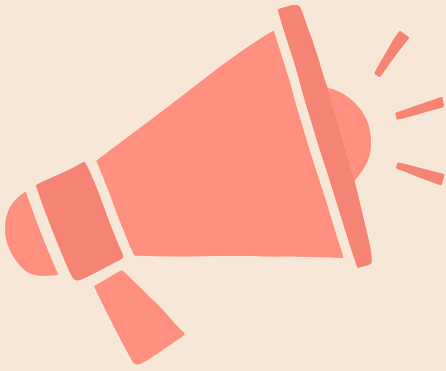
- Updated definition of consent.
- Introduction of affirmative sexual consent model.
- Changes to circumstances where there is no consent.
- Inclusion of non-consensual condom tampering or removal, 'stealthing' as a sexual offence.
- Changes to image-based sexual abuse laws.
