POSITION PURPOSE

The Associate Program Director of Ultrasound Services (Chief Sonographer) will be responsible for the day-to-day management of Ultrasound services across all applicable campuses of Eastern Health. Reporting to the Program Director Medical Imaging Eastern Health, they will be responsible for all aspects of the ultrasound service's operations including service provision, imaging protocols, appointment scheduling, staff recruitment, rostering and education, quality control, equipment maintenance scheduling and representing the Ultrasound service at the Eastern Health Medical Imaging Senior Management Committee meetings. In conjunction with senior medical imaging management they will be responsible developing policies and procedures relating to Ultrasound services and provide advice on the strategic and operational direction of the service. The Associate Program Director of Ultrasound Services will work closely with the site Associate Program Directors who have overall responsibility for services at their site.

MAJOR DUTIES AND/OR RESPONSIBILITIES

. Administrative: Responsible for the management of a well co-ordinated, integrated and

efficiently functioning Ultrasound Service with special regard to service development, staff, training and motivation and enhanced clinical responsiveness. Play a lead role in the on-going evolution of the service across Eastern Health. Achieve management and leadership requirements

under the Eastern Health "Standard Work for Leaders" framework.

2. Clinical: To perform examinations and associated duties in accordance with

standard practice, departmental policy and guidelines as described by the.

Australian Society of Ultrasound in Medicine.

3. Educational: In conjunction with the Tutor Sonographer and senior ultrasound staff,

assist in guiding the clinical practice of trainee sonographers and undergraduate students to ensure that their activities are in accordance with standard practice, departmental policy and guidelines as described by

the. Australian Society of Ultrasound in Medicine.

Key Performance Criteria:

1.1. Administrative:

1.a. Responsible for the management and provision of Ultrasound Services across Eastern Health characterised by the highest standards of quality, efficiency, safety and patient care. Achieve management and leadership requirements under the Eastern Health "Standard Work for Leaders" framework.

- **1.b** In conjunction with the Executive Director, the Program Director Medical Imaging and the Associate Director of Finance, develop and be responsible for the budget and financial performance of the service.
- **1.c.** Responsible for the Tutor, supervisors, staff and trainee sonographers, and for the direction and activity of other professional or ancillary staff who support the service.
- 1.d. Make requests upon and work with other sonography staff and trainee sonographers
- 1.e. Liaise and work with staff of other units and departments within Eastern Health
- **1.f.** Liaise with staff of other Ultrasound practices, equipment and supply companies, educational institutions etc
- 1.g. Ensure efficient management of staff and equipment to meet patient workload. In conjunction with Associate Director of Quality, Planning and Innovation Medical Imaging, maintain and develop the quality assurance program for Ultrasound Services. Assist with and maintain standards that would assure accreditation under hospital guidelines and DIAS accreditation. Be familiar with and actively maintain Q-Pulse Radiology Quality and Document Management System
- **1.h.** Liaise frequently with the Program Director Medical Imaging to discuss the operation and development of the Ultrasound service and be actively involved in the Eastern Health Medical Imaging Senior Management Committee.
- 1.i. Liaise frequently with senior ultrasound staff to discuss the operation of the Ultrasound services.
- **1.j** Continually look for new and innovative ways to improve quality and service provision for patients and customers. Lead strategic and operational change to maximise the utility of current resources and develop business plans for the expansion/enhancement of services.
- **1.k** Spend time each week at each site to liaise with supervisor sonographers and to ensure service delivery improvements are maintained.
- 11. Travel between Eastern Health sites to attend meetings etc is required.
- **1m.** Participate in other Imaging projects and have carriage over other Imaging projects and portfolios as directed by the Program Director Medical Imaging.
- 1n. Participate in the afterhours on call roster for Incident Command as directed.
- 10. Prepare and implement staff rosters. Utilise electronic time management systems for staff timekeeping and leave management. In conjunction with the service/site Associate Program Directors ensure the effective management of staff including all Human Resource and Industrial Relation issues, such as Achieve Conversations, Mandatory Training, recruitment and retention, Occupational Health and Safety, and effective change management. Ensure all staff are appropriately licensed and registered
- **1p.** Arrange the appropriate maintenance and repair of Ultrasound equipment. Ensure the availability of supplies necessary for the proper operation of the department.

2.2. Clinical:

- 2.2a. Undertake and/or direct ultrasound examinations as requested from time to time by the program Director Eastern Health Medical Imaging
- 2.2b. Perform such ultrasound examinations as requested in writing by suitably qualified medical officers or by practitioners operating under approved Eastern Health scope of practice. Perform such examinations in accordance with standard practice, departmental policy and guidelines as described by the Australian Society of Ultrasound in Medicine.
- 2.2c. Complete all such clerical duties as are normally associated with the Ultrasound imaging of patients in the Ultrasound Department, including processing of request forms, patient scheduling, recording of examinations, examination work sheets, document control, handling enquires re such procedures and preparing images for reporting
- 2.2d. Understand and comply with the Hospital's safety policies
- **2.3e.** Participate in a clinical on call roster during periods where there is operational necessity to do so.

3.3. Educational:

- 3.3a. In conjunction with the Tutor Sonographer, assist in the clinical education for trainee and post graduate staff ensuring adequate exposure to required clinical experience.
- 3.3b. Assist (if required) in the clinical assessments trainee sonographers as required by educational institutions/programs.
- 3.3c. In conjunction with the Tutor Sonographer, assist in co-ordinating an on-going in-house professional

development program for Ultra	asound.

8. PERFORMANCE DEVELOPMENT

A Performance Review (Achieve), that includes agreed targets, will occur three (3) months from commencement and then annually on the basis of the duties and responsibilities outlined in this position description. This is an opportunity to review personal and the allocated work unit's service performance, facilitated by the setting of objectives/goals and ongoing evaluation of performance and achievement. Objectives will be developed annually, documented, discussed and agreed with the immediate line manager, who will act as the assessor. The incumbent is expected to demonstrate and show evidence annually of on-going self and allocated work unit's service development.
