1. EASTERN HEALTH - HEALTHIER TOGETHER

Eastern Health is one of Melbourne's largest metropolitan public health services. We provide a comprehensive range of high quality acute, sub-acute, palliative care, mental health, drug and alcohol, residential care, community health and statewide services to people and communities that are diverse in culture, age and socio- economic status, population and healthcare needs. 'Being part of Eastern Health is being part of a welcoming team of healthcare experts' is achieved through Eastern Health's strategic goal of HEALTHIER TOGETHER.



2. POSITION PURPOSE

Eastern Health Consultation Liaison (CL) Psychiatry service provides a consultation-liaison service for medical and surgical inpatients at Box Hill, Maroondah, Angliss, Wantirna Hospitals and Peter James Centre. Our service addresses the interface of medicine and psychiatry, and aims to improve the quality of care for all patients in Eastern Health with co-existing psychiatric, psychological or behavioural difficulties affecting their medical management.

In collaboration with the Clinical Head of Adult Acute Mental Health, the Consultation Liaison Consultant Psychiatrist is responsible for the leadership, management, and delivery of clinical service, staff education, and patient advocacy within the service.

The Consultation Liaison Psychiatrist is a key member of the CL team which is supported by a Lead CL Consultant and Manager as well as Senior CL Clinicians, Psychiatry Registrars and Medical Interns. The CL Psychiatrist will also assist with the quality and effectiveness of the Eastern Health Adult Mental

Health Services through the provision of professional supervision and contribute to the development of quality assurance processes and practices.

3. MAJOR DUTIES AND/OR RESPONSIBILITIES

The CL Psychiatrist is responsible for the delivery of a high quality clinical care within the Consultation Liaison psychiatry mental health service underpinned by the framework of recovery orientated practice of promoting a culture of hope, promoting autonomy as well as self-determination, developing collaborative partnerships and meaningful engagement, focusing on the patients' strengths, providing holistic and personalised care, supporting patients to utilise and enhance their existing support networks, supporting patients to engage in social and vocational networks and communities of their choosing, being responsive to diversity as well as ongoing self reflection and continuous learning.

In collaboration with the Clinical Program Director, Clinical Heads of Unit and Clinical Directors, the CL Psychiatrist is also responsible for pursuing the defined strategic direction and developing goals for the adult mental health service that is recovery based, goal orientated, outcome focused and supports professional learning and service improvement.

- To provide good clinical leadership within the CL Psychiatry service
- The CL Psychiatrist will be based at Maroondah Hospital but may, at times be required to provide sessions at Angliss and Box Hill Hospitals
- Undertake specialist mental health assessments of patients referred from the medical and surgical inpatient units
- To practice Evidence Based medicine
- Provide specialist mental health consultation service which will offer management advice to the multidisciplinary team caring for the patients
- To provide ongoing assessment to monitor and review the effectiveness of intervention strategies implemented
- To facilitate access to public or private mental health services for the patients
- Ensure ongoing liaison occurs between medical, surgical and mental health teams
- Provide support and psychoeducation to patients and their family/carers about mental illness
- To liaise with other specialist services to ensure that the needs of patients with co-morbid mental health needs are met
- To promote the most effective use of resources in providing appropriate care of these patients
- To promote and provide education to staff about mental health
- To implement education programs for staff to promote development of skills in risk assessment and clinical practice in the management of patients with mental health issues
- To actively participate in team meetings, clinical reviews and supervisors meetings within the Eastern Health Mental Health program
- To provide clinical and college supervision for the Psychiatry Registrars working in the service and appropriate supervision to the CL medical interns

- To promote service initiatives and developments related to managing patients with mental health issues
- To ensure that the objectives, polices, rules and regulations established by Eastern Health are implemented
- To ensure that the Mental health Recovery Framework and new National Standards on Recovery are adhered to within working practices
- Promote strong interagency relationships and ensure timely and accurate information sharing between services with shared consumers
- Provides leadership and direction in the development of behaviour that enhances communication, interaction and achievement of the Adult Mental Health Program in keeping with the mission and strategic goals of the service
- Maintain a commitment to continuous quality improvement through ongoing evaluation of the service provided
- Facilitate professional and personal development by networking with other professional/community groups

The CL Psychiatrist will take clinical responsibility for designated medical staff working within the CL Psychiatry team. They will both provide and ensure that all medical staff receives the required amount of formal as well as informal supervision.

3.1 Communication

- Promote & implement a client focused team approach to ensure continuous quality improvement.
- Be responsible for the implementation of policies, guidelines and protocols for CL Psychiatry

3.2 Quality and Clinical Review Activities (refer also to section 6)

 Work with the Director of Acute Adult Mental Health service in achieving accreditation standards for all areas

3.3 Education, Research & Professional development (refer also to section 5)

- Foster an environment of education, quality improvement, evidence based practice and reflective feedback and learning.
- Ensure that the training and education needs of medical students as well as junior and senior medical staff are in line with standards and available resources
- Facilitate and encourage a culture of training, education and research opportunities across the adult acute service.

3.4 Efficiency

The CL Psychiatrist will, having regard to best practice patient care:

- assist the Health Service to achieve productivity and efficiency measures of comparable hospitals, by ensuring maximal and efficient utilisation of resources;
- cooperate with data collection procedures;
- comply with the rules and regulations of the Health Service, including notification of absences and appropriate prior notification of impending leave.

3.5 Performance Review (refer also to section 9)

The CL Psychiatrist will participate in active performance management systems within the organization.

- Extensive experience in mental health sector and sound knowledge of the relevant legislation pertaining to adult acute mental health.
- Extensive experience in clinical leadership and delivery of services for adult acute mental health services.
- Demonstrated ability in service development, policy and planning.
- Demonstrated experience in Human resource management and effective experience in industrial relations
- Demonstrated experience in providing leadership within the public mental health system.
- Demonstrate a strong team spirit and ability to work closely and collaboratively with colleagues, managers, and other members of a multidisciplinary team.
- Demonstrated negotiation and advocacy skills.
- Extensive conflict resolution experience.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills.
- Understanding of family sensitive practice and contribution of carers and consumers in treatment decisions and planning.
- Enthusiasm, drive and motivation to achieve best possible outcomes for the relevant area of service as well as for Eastern Health in general.
- Experience in undergraduate teaching and participation in post graduate education activities.
