1. POSITION SUMMARY

The eHealth Change and Training Analyst is responsible for managing change initiatives and developing training programs related to electronic medical record. This role ensures that changes to eHealth applications and processes are effectively implemented, communicated, and adopted by end-users. The analyst will work closely with stakeholders to identify training needs, create educational materials, and facilitate training sessions to support the successful adoption of the solutions.

The analyst will play a pivotal role in project initiatives, particularly in rolling out CareSync Exchange to Eastern Health clinicians. Please refer to attachment #2 for **Project Summary - CareSync Exchange**.

2. MAJOR DUTIES AND/OR RESPONSIBILITIES

- Deliver a change management plan to ensure adoption of CareSync Exchange by clinical staff at Eastern Health
- Liaise with clinical groups to identify and address change issues as they are identified by end users, including senior and junior medical staff, nursing, allied health and clinical support staff
- Review, develop and implement the communication plan to ensure the project is branded and marketed in a manner that involves full stakeholder and end user involvement.
- Develop processes to ensure on-going tracking, achieving of targets and reporting of benefits is continued after the implementation of CareSync Exchange is complete
- Develop and implement a training plan to deliver effective education of CareSync Exchange
- Encourage the recruitment of super users of the system
- Lead training events including super user training and end user training
- Provide adoption coaching during Go Live period

- Report as required to the Project Lead with compliance in utilising project tools and controls including status reports, risk and issue logs
- Act as project champion and provide ongoing positive promotion of the project
- Other duties as requested by mutual consent

CareSync Exchange Project Summary

The Victorian Government is improving the safety and continuity of care for patients through the sharing of health information across Victoria's public health services and hospitals.

The Department of Health is implementing CareSync Exchange, a secure electronic patient health information sharing system, to provide clinicians with critical patient health information at the point of care.

CareSync Exchange improves safety and continuity across Victorian public health services. Clinicians will spend less time seeking information, enabling more time to do what they do best: providing care to patients.

With CareSync Exchange, the patient's treating clinician can access the following information to support clinical decision making and continuity of care:

- Patient details, including demographics and emergency contacts.
- Patient hospital visits including inpatient, emergency, and outpatient.
- Clinical documents, diagnostic test reports and hospital discharge summaries.

As CareSync Exchange continues to evolve, clinicians will be able to view additional clinical information, such as:

- medications
- allergies
- radiology reports

CareSync Exchange supports a more seamless patient experience, reduces unnecessary tests and builds a more integrated public healthcare system focused on improving patient safety and outcomes.
