1. POSITION PURPOSE

Essential core features:

- To provide for the day to day clinical management of patients under the care and direction of the Director of Rehabilitation Medicine / Rehabilitation Medicine Physician to ensure a high quality of patient care.
- To be actively involved in teaching Medical Students and Junior Medical Staff.
- To conduct research or quality projects if required.

3. SAFE PRACTICE AND ENVIRONMENT

Occupational Health and Safety

Eastern Health is committed to provide and maintain a working environment for all staff that is safe and without risk to health. You are expected to participate in the personal development process on an annual basis.

5. QUALITY

As a staff member of Eastern Health staff are required to comply with Eastern Health performance standards and participate in continuous monitoring and improvement as part of your role. You are also required to comply with legislation, professional standards and accreditation standards.

As a staff member employed by Eastern Health services you must have and maintain the appropriate skills and knowledge required to fulfil your role and responsibilities within the organisation. In addition, you must ensure that you practice within the specifications of this position description, and where applicable within the agreed scope of practice.

You are responsible for ensuring safe high quality care in your work. This will include complying with best practice standards, identifying and reporting any variance to expected standards and minimising the risk of adverse outcomes and patient harm. In addition, you will ensure that service and care is consistent with the EH approach to patient and family centered care.

6. CONFIDENTIALITY

Any information obtained in the course of employment is confidential and should not be used for any purpose other than the performance of the duties for which the person was employed. Staff are bound by the Information Privacy Act 2000 and the Health Records Act 2001.

7. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

You agree to adhere to the Equal Employment Opportunity policies and practices of the Health Service. Discriminatory practices, including sexual harassment, are unlawful. The Health Service will not tolerate discriminatory behaviour and any such conduct may lead to the invoking of the Disciplinary Policy and Procedure, which may result in termination of employment.

8. PERFORMANCE DEVELOPMENT

A Performance Review, that includes agreed targets, will occur three (3) months from commencement and then annually on the basis of the duties and responsibilities outlined in this position description. This is an opportunity to review personal and the allocated work unit's service performance, facilitated by the setting of objectives/goals and ongoing evaluation of performance and achievement. Objectives will be developed annually, documented, discussed and agreed with the immediate line manager, who will act as the assessor. The incumbent is expected to demonstrate and show evidence annually of on-going self and allocated work unit's service development.

ATTACHMENT 1

KEY SELECTION CRITERIA

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1. Assess and formulate a management plan for patients admitted to the Rehabilitation Unit and for patients referred for consultation.
2. Supervise the Hospital Medical Officer and ensure that accurate and relevant patient documentation including admission, progress documentation, treatment sheets, discharge notes are completed by the Hospital Medical Officer (or Registrar).
3. Ensure that assessment and management decisions are communicated to the Rehabilitation Unit consultant and other care providers including nursing and allied health staff to promote continuity of patient care.
4. Communication with the patient, and family/carers where appropriate, about assessment and management plans.
5. Supervise the quality of the medical discharge summaries and ensure that these are completed on the day of patient's discharge from hospital and signed and forwarded to General Practitioner.
6. Communicate with General Practitioners; especially in relation to discharge plans and post discharge follow up.
7. Attend Rehabilitation Unit ward rounds, team review meetings and family meetings.
8. Take part in quality improvement activities relevant to the unit and present findings to appropriate meetings.
9. Attend relevant outpatient clinics, as required.
10. Attend and take an active part in unit and hospital educational activities, included Hospital Medical Officer teaching.
11. Take part in the after hours roster as applicable.
12. Inform Medical Administration of any issues related to patient care or general hospital organisation about which you have concerns.
13. Be aware of safety procedures, fire and evacuation plans.
